In Great Britain, the Sainsbury supermarkets are starting to work on the packaging of products, which are thrown into garbage even if the food is still edible. It is a label placed on the front of the packaging

Tesco has been at the forefront of food waste prevention for several years, ranking as the best supermarket for reducing food waste levels in 2018. This comes when Tesco released its data on food waste for the eighth year (23 September) and encourages other food retailers and businesses to do the same. Food waste reporting for UK retailers is currently voluntary, but Tesco has previously asked the government to make it mandatory. Tesco has reached a sustainable development agreement with 24 of its food suppliers with the goal of halving food waste by 2030

For the British supermarket cooperative East of England Co-op he sells expired food for 10 pance . the East Anglia chain is the first to propose the anti-waste initiative in the UK and consumers are happy to be able to buy their favorite products at a lower price: even when they have passed the "Best Before" date. it could save up to 50,000 references a year that would otherwise be thrown away. Like about 50% of the food produced in the world every year

The anti-waste is one of the several "green" initiatives implemented by the East of England Co-op. The chain is also sensitive to helping the less fortunate: being unable to donate expired food, charities cannot receive it by law, so the supermarket collects donations of food that have no expiry date and items for personal hygiene. Last year alone, 80,000 food was collected from donors and brought to 22 charitable canteens in the area.



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
